### Harding to Discuss Race and Gender Issues in Keynote Address

Sandra Harding of the University of Delaware will examine how issues of objectivity, gender and race affect scientific inquiry in the ASHE conference keynote address.

"Maximizing the objectivity of research and scholarship requires increasing gender and 'racial' diversity in surprising ways," Harding said, "The conventional notion of objectivity is a weak one; it is 'strong objectivity' that is called for by the new social science movements,"


Harding said the new social movements are challenging not only the prevailing local and global political relations, but also the theories of knowledge that have supported and been supported by them.

"This epistemological revolution has implications for teaching, policy analysis and administrative practice as well as for research and scholarship," she said.

Harding will discuss these issues from 4 to 5:30 p.m., Thurs., Oct. 29, in Ballrooms III and IV.

### Academic Community is Topic of Gamson Address

Zelda Gamson of the New England Resource Center for Higher Education at the University of Massachusetts-Boston will examine the destruction of academic community from the perspective of ASHE and her personal experiences in academia during her address on Sat., Oct. 31.

"There is a transition going on in ASHE from the founding generation to the younger generation at a time when there is great turmoil in higher education and the larger society as a whole,"

Gamson said.

"Transitions are good when they are accomplished with vision and clarity. It is important that ASHE change if only because higher education and society have changed, but ASHE should be more than a microcosm—it should also be a leader and a model. We especially need ASHE to be a model of community and collaboration, for it is only then that we will be able to do significant scholarly work on the deep changes occurring in society and higher education."

Gamson will offer suggestions for increasing community during her address from 10:15 to 11:45 on Sat., Oct. 31, in Ballrooms III and IV.


